- By heeding universal precautions and assuming coworkers currently have the COVID-19 virus, you should always focus on the six-foot social distancing rule.
- At this time, child care may not be available. Bringing children to school property will defeat the cleaning and disinfecting activities district staff are implementing. Adhere to the six-foot social distancing protocol and discourage school employees from allowing children on district property.
